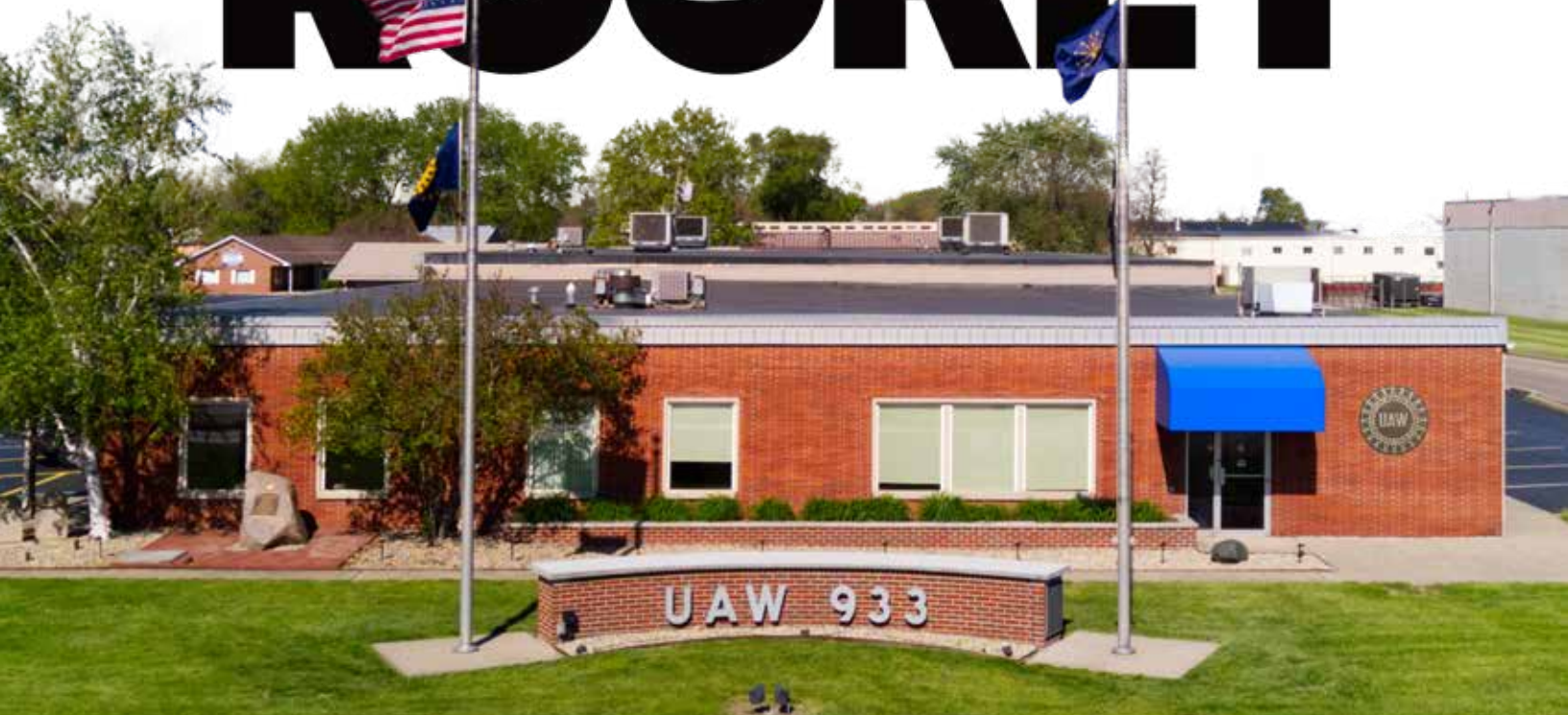

- ❑ **January 1, 2026 – New Year's Day:** A new start, new goals, and another chance to grow stronger together.

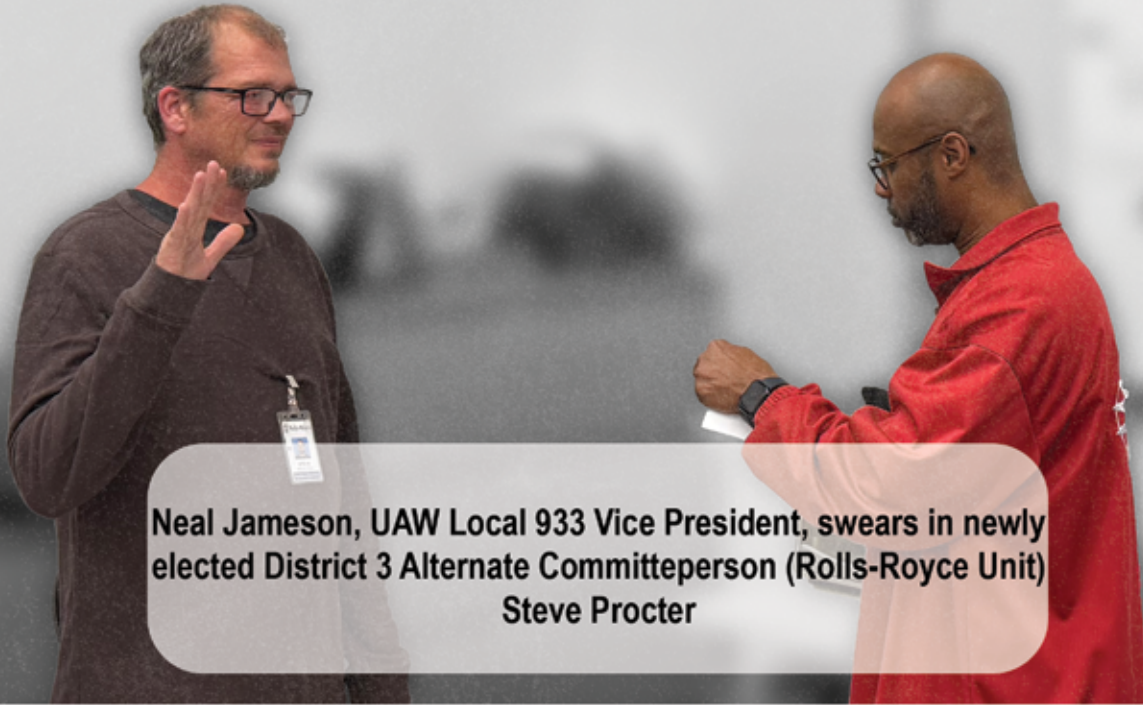

With this addition of the Rocket, we bring 2025 to a close. This year we have seen over 100 UAW Local 933/Rolls-Royce employees leave through attrition. We have had 93 retire, 3 leave the company and 6 pass away. The company also brought in 15 new production employees in September and 19 employees have been made offers and should arrive on their jobs in November 2025. The company has hired 9 new skilled trades' employees and made 3 new apprentices this year with a few more skilled trades jobs posted on the Indeed app. Great to see new employees arriving all of which will grow into Legacy wages (**NO More Tier Wages**). All employees will have a **C.O.L.A. (.65C today)** along with 120 hours starting vacation time in year one and 160 hours vacation in year two. Thank you, UAW!

Liftfan and Liftworks in Plainfield have moved from those facilities to their new location in the refurbished test cell area behind Assembly in the Performance building. The move is near complete and almost all employees have made the transition to the new location. Construction will continue as refurbished office space in Performance is completed.

Up at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana (Purdue's new Aerospace park), the first UAW EATM has arrived. Thank you, Shop Committee, for your diligent work establishing a Union presence at this new location.

The new contract book for the 2025 UAW Local 933/Rolls-Royce negotiations are being printed and are expected to be on the docks late October. For those who would like a copy for your phone or computer, please check out our website (uaw933rr.com) and download the PDF version for viewing. You can also use the below QR code and visit the site. This website helps keep our members connected so we can represent you at the highest level. If you are not on the text service, see your Union representation and get signed up.

Working in a facility that produces military engines and components brings extra attention to our Veterans. Every November 11 we pause to pay tribute to all those who have served in our military. As we continue to work hard and do our part to support our service members and veterans, take a moment to find a veteran and say, **thank you for your service**.
