RICHARD T. GOSSER SCHOLARSHIP

TO BE ELIGIBLE...

1. An applicant must be a son, daughter or ward of a member in good standing of a Local Union affiliated with the Richard T. Gosser Scholarship Program, and who is not employed full-time by the International Union.

2. An applicant must be a Senior of a high school class graduating between January, 2021 and July, 2021.

3. After filling out the application form completely, have it certified by the Local Union (President, Vice President, Financial Secretary or Recording Secretary) and mail or bring same to:

Richard T. Gosser Scholarship Program 1691 Woodlands Drive Maumee, Ohio 43537

Note: It is not necessary to submit anything but the application at this time. ACT test scores are not due until February 24, 2021.

APPLICATION MUST BE "U.S. MAIL" postmarked no later than October 15, 2020.

THIS DEADLINE IS FIRM AND NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!

REGARDING ACT TESTING:

If the applicant has NOT previously taken the ACT Test, the taking of this test during one of the coming months of SEPTEMBER, OCTOBER, or DECEMBER is a requirement. The SAT test DOES "NOT" qualify. You may register at www.actstudent.org and list code #9894. ACT Scores need to be sent directly to the Richard T. Gosser Scholarship Program and received no later than the close of business on February 24, 2021.

Summer is in full bloom; it is dry at times and hot more of the time. If it were not for a pandemic, it would be a great summer. Most of us are still quarantined and living a solitary life with a mask around our face most of the time. It is a strange time for sure. I walked into the bank and cashed a check. I had a mask on the whole time, and no one called the police or even

blinked an eye for that matter.

This virus is still winning. We all know someone close to us that has survived the virus and we know someone dear to us that did not survive. The international office remains closed. The regional office remains closed and our hall is on a limited basis. I will not go into numbers and cases and all that stuff because we all follow the news and dread to hear the reports. We have not had a meeting in almost 6 months and truthfully, I doubt we will meet until December or even January.

The truth of the matter is that we seniors are all at high risk and the executive board and I are very reluctant to call a meeting for several reasons. Why risk spreading the virus needlessly? There are several guidelines we would have to follow such as taking temperatures at the door, maintaining 6-foot social distancing, and mandating the wearing of masks. The region has canceled all meetings so there is little, if any information to share. The one thing that is going on is elections. So, let's talk about elections for a bit.

I think we will all agree that our democracy depends on information. Which polices are important, what laws are needed and how is the economy going? There will be a nonstop flow of information from social media feeds and sadly, foreign agents. The TV will bombard us with debates and comments and unlimited ads. I want to share a couple of points to consider avoiding political misinformation.

Dark money is defined as funds raised for the purpose of influencing elections by nonprofit organizations that are not required to disclose the identities of their donors. Emotional versus rational response to dark money ads are meant to trigger fear, outrage, and harbor a lot of misinformation. Try not to react to information from an unknown origin that is not backed up by credible evidence. Do not share or like an article you have not read... do not risk your credibility and risk polluting feeds from family and friends.

Learn to spot misinformation patterns, including memes, which are themes that appear humorous but seem to discourage something such as long lines at the voting site, broken voting machines, voter fraud that casts doubt on mail in voting. It is okay to be skeptical without becoming cynical of the voting process.

Five years ago, there were 44 fact finding organizations and today there are 195 and counting. I use several reliable fact checking organizations; Truth or Fiction, Snopes, Politico and Factstream. I am a progressive Democrat, so these sites work for me. Now, not all of us are leaning to the left so you have several sites to use. I will mention one I check but after that you are on your own. Real Clear Politics and one neutral site is Open Secrets.org.

Keep these tips in mind and get involved. Do not let your values and beliefs get manipulated by false narratives. If you see something online that is false, fake, or misleading, do something. Warn others with a comment or a reply. It may not be the most popular thing to do but democracy requires nothing less.

Before I go, I want to acknowledge our members that are or have gotten over the virus. I want to extend peace and mercy to those that have lost loved ones and I am very thankful that our vice chairman, Don Reed was in the hospital. He is home now and has a very reliable nurse taking caring of him (thanks Suzy).

On behalf of the Executive Board and myself, stay safe and we will get through this pandemic together. WEAR A MASK...
