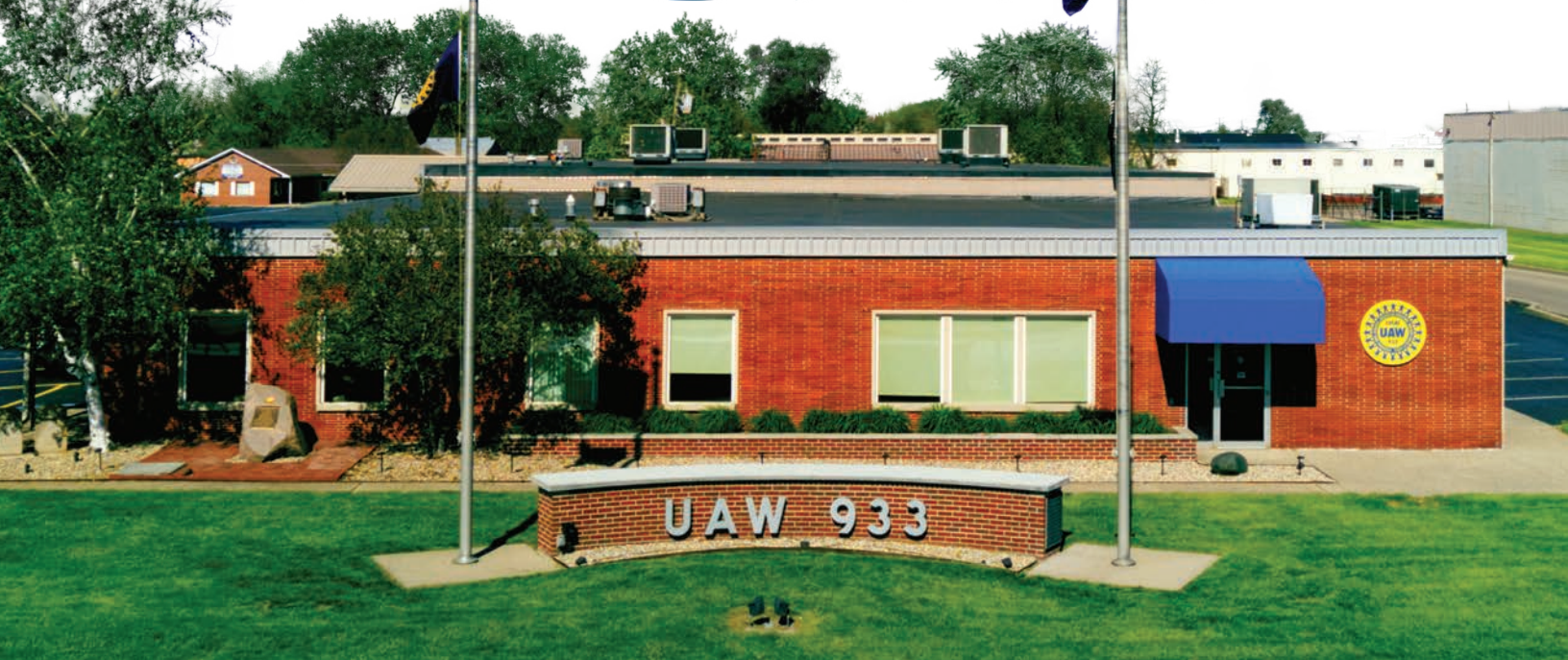

Future Test Cell Expansion

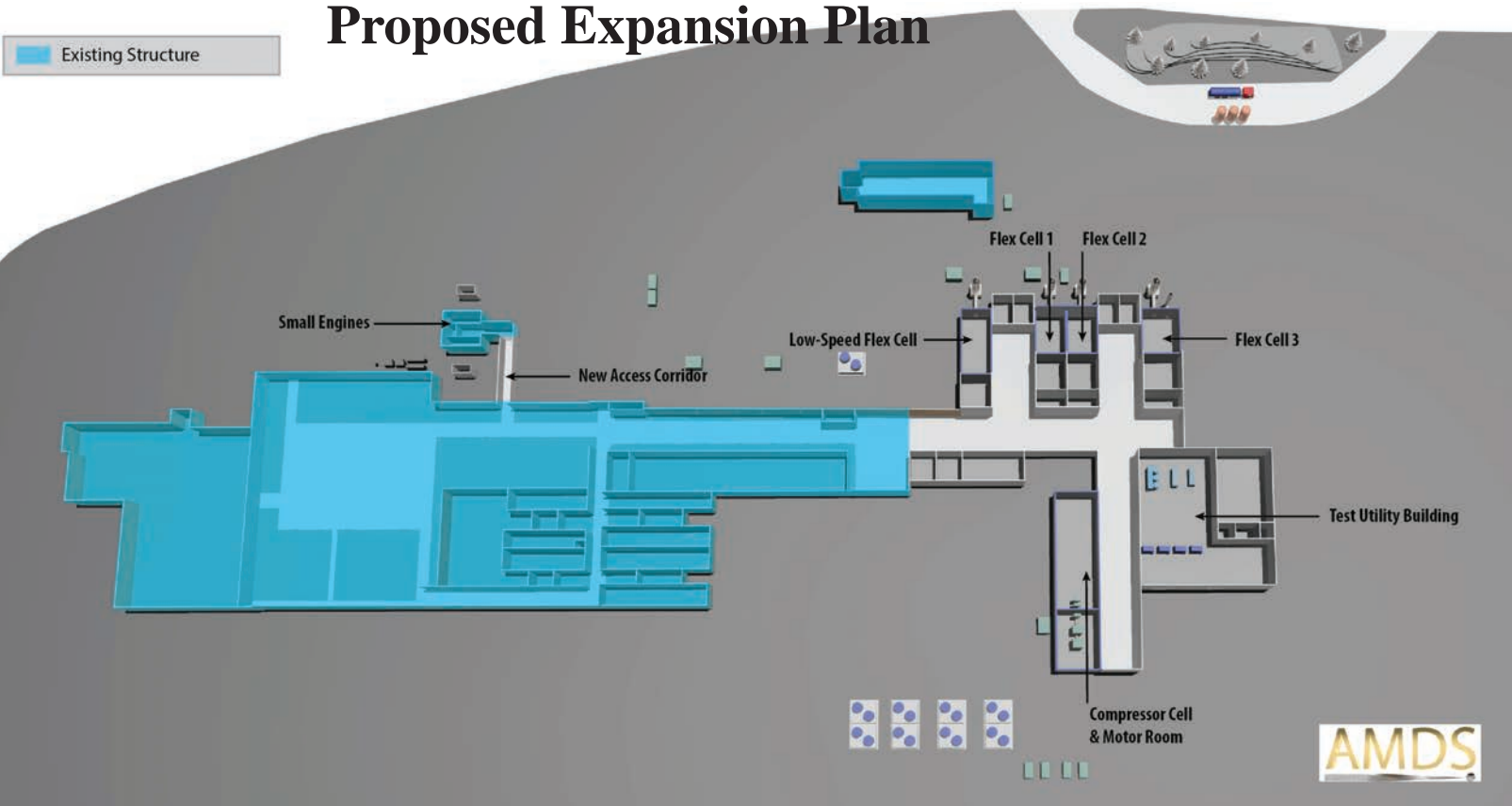
Investment has been made to ensure future test facilities in Indianapolis keep us competitive. An estimated \$300 million dollars in future test cells will happen over the next four to five years. Four new flex cells that connect to the Rolls-Royce Indianapolis Performance building will be added. This includes a new sub-station, fuel farm, cooling towers and load absorbers. These new test cells will handle turbo prop and turbo shaft engines.

There will also be a new compressor test cell for use on new development engines.

An August 2021 press release stated Rolls-Royce and Purdue University has launched a new major investment project. A new test facility for high altitude, hybrid-electric engines, and hypersonic research will be utilized to power the next generation of U.S. military aircraft. Today, Rolls-Royce Indianapolis conducts 20 altitude tests a year. This work will still be done by UAW employees traveling to West Lafayette. Rolls-Royce will become a larger partner with Purdue Universities Aerospace District.

Cross Pointe Facility Closure

As stated publicly, the Rolls-Royce Cross Pointe Facility has closed leaving Rolls-Royce Indianapolis with an opportunity to add an additional 40 machines from that location. This list will include two additional Hoffman broaches, 10 Winbro EDM machines and another Hermle multi-machining centre to name a few. Again, this investment will allow opportunity to gain future work and help keep our workers working.

Standard Hours

As we currently struggle with standard hours, the UAW commitment is to look for solutions to keep the business competitive and use all contractual language to ensure jobs are preserved. Recently, a voluntary early reduction program was offered to eligible workers age 65 or older, 64 and 63. The current offer allows retirement eligible employees the opportunity to retire and take advantage of an additional \$70,000. The newly negotiated incentive was added in the 2020 UAW/Rolls-Royce contract negotiations. This offer will help keep new employees on the job. In the event of any type of work force reduction, other provisions such as VTEP (page 155 on National Agreement) would be offered. In addition, the factory cannot maintain more than a 20% overtime (over a three-month average) if there are employees on recall or rehire.

In closing, I would like to ensure our UAW brothers and sisters that our Union is fighting for you. I am very proud of the job our elected and appointed people do supporting the Union workers in our factories. Despite challenging times there is a hope for tomorrow, and we will get through this together. Again, thank you all for the jobs you do.

UAW PUBLIC REVIEW BOARD

The UAW Public Review Board (PRB) was established in 1957 as an additional way to safeguard members' rights and act as a

watchdog over the union's moral and ethical practices. The board, which is funded by the UAW, acts independently on internal appeals and its decisions are final.

The UAW is believed to be the only U.S. union that allows an independent board such authority. As the final decision-maker on internal appeals, those who wish to bring a case before the PRB must first try to have their dispute resolved where it started; if the dispute is with a local, the member's appeal

starts there. If with an international representative, the member appeals to the International Executive Board (IEB), which also hears appeals of unresolved local issues.

In most cases, if the IEB denies the appeal, the member may then request the PRB review the case. The PRB has internationally recognized experts in a variety of fields such as labor-management relations and law and ethics. It meets in person on appeals and via conference call on issues such as election results, the proper withdrawal of grievances, or any other action by union officials or representatives.

Sixty-one years after President Walter Reuther's vision for a more democratic union, the PRB still holds true to the values of fairness and integrity, PRB Co-chair Janice R. Bellace told delegates at the 37th UAW Constitutional Convention in June 2018. The board heard 72 appeals, a slight increase in volume from the prior four-year period, and in the vast majority of cases the PRB concluded that the union had acted properly, consistent with the terms of the UAW Constitution, of negotiated agreements, or of local bylaws, said Bellace, a professor of legal studies at The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. 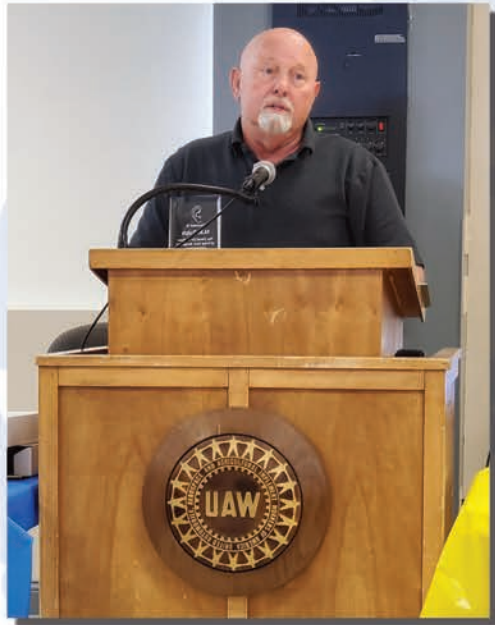

Why are these important and how does it concern Retirees you ask? It concerns us because we need strong union voices in congress to protect the things we depend on: our pensions, our health benefits and of course Social Security. You will hear more on this as the bills pass through Congress.

In closing, don't forget August 28th. The retirees will have a table so if you have memorabilia from those early years, please bring them to exhibit and show how proud we are of our past.

2022 PROGRAM

The Richard T. Gosser Scholarship Program accepts applications from the daughters and sons of UAW Region 2B members graduating between January, 2022 and July, 2022. The ACT test is required. If the student has not previously taken the ACT, they should sign up to take the ACT test in the coming months of SEPTEMBER, OCTOBER, or DECEMBER, and have your test scores sent to our office by listing our code number **#9894**.

Finalists are based on ACT scores and will be notified in writing. As a finalist, applications are assessed by a team of prominent community leaders and educators, who then select the winners based on ACT scores, class rank, extra-curricular activities, letters of recommendation, personality traits and leadership abilities. Documentation regarding class rank, extra-curricular activities, letters of recommendation, personality traits and leadership abilities are required from all finalist, but not required with the initial application.
